Foreword from Saumitra

Dear future Austria student,

I have been doing this work for 14 years. In that time, I have personally counselled more than 2,500 Indian families about studying in Europe, and placed over 80 students at top Austrian universities — TU Wien, WU Vienna, JKU Linz, TU Graz, University of Vienna, BOKU, University of Innsbruck, Medical University Vienna (MUW), and IST Austria. Our alumni now work at Siemens Austria, OMV Vienna, Red Bull Salzburg, BMW Steyr, Voestalpine Linz, Magna Steyr, AVL List Graz, and various Vienna-based EU agencies.

Here is what I have learned: **Austria is Europe's best-kept education secret for Indian students.** Most consultants ignore Austria because they're too busy pushing Germany and the Netherlands. Why Austria — The Hidden European Gem

Quick read: Austria hosts approximately 12,000 Indian students. TU Wien ranks #180 globally. 3. ASEA-UNINET — Asia-Europe Network

ASEA-UNINET is a network of European and Asian universities. Indian students can apply for short research stays in Austria (1-6 months) with stipends of EUR 1,150/month + travel + insurance. Applications via your Indian home university's international office.

4. Eurasia-Pacific Uninet — PhD Focus

For Indian PhD candidates conducting research at Austrian universities. EUR 1,260/month for up to 9 months. Apply via eurasiapacific.com.

5. TU Wien Excellence Scholarship

TU Wien offers EUR 8,000 to outstanding international Master's applicants. Apply through TU Wien Online by March 15.

6. WU Vienna Excellence Scholarship

WU Vienna offers EUR 5,000-10,000 partial scholarships for non-EU MSc and MBA students. Apply with admission application.

7. University of Vienna Bilateral Scholarships

University of Vienna offers exchange-based bilateral grants with select Indian universities. Check via your home university's international office.

8. Erasmus Mundus Joint Master's at Austrian Universities

TU Wien Application — Step by Step

1. **Visit TU Wien Online application portal** at tuwien.at/en/studies/applications. Create account.
2. **Choose Master's program(s)**. You can apply to multiple programs.
3. **Upload all documents** (transcripts, degree, IELTS, SOP, LORs, passport).
4. **No application fee** for most Master's programs.
5. **Submit by September 5** (winter intake) or **February 5** (summer intake).
6. **Wait for decision:** 8-12 weeks. Some programs interview.
7. **Receive Letter of Admission** via TU Wien portal.
8. **Apply for Austrian student visa** at VFS Austria India.

WU Vienna Application — Step by Step

1. **Visit WU online application:** wu.ac.at/en/students/applications
2. **Select MBA, MSc, or PhD program.**
3. **Upload all required documents** + apostilled transcripts.
4. **Pay application fee** (EUR 50 for MBA programs only).
5. **Submit by April 30** for September intake (MBA varies).
6. **Wait for decision:** 6-10 weeks.

Austria Student Visa: Visa D via VFS

Quick read: Austria issues a Visa D for students staying 90+ days. Apply via VFS Austria India after admission letter. Processing: 8-12 weeks. Documents include admission letter, accommodation proof, EUR 13,217 financial proof for 12 months, and apostilled degree certificate. Visa fee EUR 150.

Step-by-Step Visa Application

1. **Get your Letter of Admission** from Austrian university.
2. **Book VFS Austria appointment** at vfsglobal.com/austria/india. Centers in Delhi, Mumbai, Chennai, Bangalore, Hyderabad, Ahmedabad, Pune.
3. **Gather all documents** (full list below).
4. **Submit financial proof:** EUR 13,217 in your Austrian frozen account OR bank statement showing equivalent in Indian bank for 6+ months OR sponsorship from Austrian guarantor.
5. **Get apostille** on Bachelor's degree + transcripts via Indian state authority + MEA.
6. **Pay visa fee:** EUR 150 (Rs 14,000 approx) + VFS service charge.
7. **Attend biometrics** at VFS center.
8. **Wait for decision:** 8-12 weeks. Visa stamped in passport.
9. **Travel to Austria within visa validity** (90 days after issue).
10. **Within 3 days of arrival:** Register Meldezettel at local district office (this is mandatory in Austria).

First 30 Days in Austria: Meldezettel + Bank + Insurance

Quick read: Within 3 days of arrival, register at your district office (Meldezettel — mandatory!). Open a bank account at Erste Bank, Bank Austria, or BAWAG. Register for Austrian student health insurance (~EUR 60/month). Get e-card (health card).

Day-by-Day Arrival Checklist

- 1. Day 1-2:** Arrive in Austria. Vienna airport (VIE) is the main gateway. Take train to your city (Graz 2.5h, Linz 1.5h, Salzburg 3h, Innsbruck 4h).
- 2. Day 1-3:** Move into accommodation. OeAD assigns student dorms (apply 6 months ahead!); otherwise check WG-Gesucht.at or Studenten.at.
- 3. Day 1-3:** Register Meldezettel at **Magistratisches Bezirksamt** (Vienna) or local Bezirksamt (other cities). MANDATORY within 3 working days. Required: passport + visa + lease + filled Meldezettel form.
- 4. Day 3-10:** Open bank account at Erste Bank, Bank Austria, or BAWAG PSK. Required: passport + Meldezettel + university letter + cash for initial deposit.
- 5. Day 5-15:** Register for student health insurance with OEGK (OE Gesundheitskasse). Fee ~EUR 60/month for students. Receive e-card.
- 6. Day 15-30:** Visit Magistratisches Bezirksamt for residence permit (Aufenthaltsbewilligung) — convert your D visa to a 12-month residence permit. Fee EUR 160.
- 7. Day 7-15:** Get Austrian SIM (A1, Magenta, Drei). EUR 10-20/month for student plans.
- 8. Day 15-30:** Buy annual public transport pass: Vienna Wiener Linien Klimaticket Annual EUR 365 covers all of Austria, OR EUR 75/year just Vienna.
- 9. Day 15-30:** University orientation week + course registration via student portal.

Where to Live: Vienna, Graz, Salzburg, Innsbruck, Linz

Quick read: Vienna (most jobs, EUR 450-650/mo room), Graz (lively, EUR 350-500), Linz (JKU AI hub, EUR 350-450), Salzburg (Mozart's city, EUR 400-550), Innsbruck (Alpine + quantum, EUR 400-550). Always apply for OeAD student housing 6 months before arrival.
