Foreword from Saumitra

Dear future Poland student,

I have been doing this work for 14 years. Our alumni now work at Google Warsaw, Microsoft Krakow, Atos, Capgemini Poland, Asseco, Comarch, and many EU tech firms.

Here is what I have learned: **Poland is Europe's smartest value-for-money education destination.** Most consultants overlook Poland because they're focused on Germany/UK/Netherlands. But Poland offers something unique: top-200 European technical universities at one-third Western Europe tuition. Warsaw University of Technology is Poland's MIT — ranks #538 globally but #1 in Eastern Europe for engineering. AGH Krakow is one of Europe's top mining and metallurgy universities. Jagiellonian Krakow (founded 1364) is one of the oldest universities in the world.

Why Poland — Quality + Affordability

Quick read: Poland hosts approximately 8,000 Indian students. Warsaw University of Technology, Jagiellonian, AGH Krakow lead engineering and sciences. 500+ English-taught programs. Tuition EUR 2,000-6,000/year (one-third of Western Europe). Total 2-year MSc: Rs 12-18 lakh.

The Five Reasons That Actually Matter

Reason 1: EU Degrees at One-Third Western Europe Cost

6. Wait for decision: 6-12 weeks

Poland Student Visa: Type D via VFS

Quick read: Poland issues Type D National Visa for students staying 90+ days. Apply via VFS Poland in India after admission letter. Processing: 6-10 weeks. Visa fee EUR 80.

First 30 Days: PESEL + Bank + Insurance

Quick read: Within 30 days of arrival, register PESEL (Polish national ID number). Open bank account at PKO BP, mBank, or Santander Poland. Apply for student health insurance with NFZ (Polish public health system).

- 1. Day 1-3:** Arrive in Poland. Most students fly into Warsaw Chopin (WAW) or Krakow Balice (KRK). Trains/buses to other cities.
- 2. Day 1-7:** Move into accommodation. University dorms (Akademik) or private rentals.
- 3. Day 7-15:** Apply for PESEL at local commune (Urząd Miasta). PESEL is Polish national ID.
- 4. Day 7-15:** Open bank account at PKO BP (most accessible), mBank, or Santander.
- 5. Day 15-30:** Register with NFZ (Polish public health insurance) — free for students.
- 6. Day 15-30:** Get Polish SIM (Plus, Orange, Play). EUR 7-12/month for student plans.
- 7. Day 15-30:** University orientation week + course registration.

Warsaw — Capital

1.8 million residents. Most jobs (Google, Microsoft, banks). EUR 600-800/month total. Indian community 4,000+.

Krakow — Cultural Capital

800,000 residents. Tech hub (Microsoft Krakow), beautiful medieval old town. EUR 550-700/month. Indian community 2,000+.

Wroclaw — IT Hub

640,000 residents. Major IT companies (Capgemini, Atos). EUR 500-650/month. Smaller Indian community 700+.

Poznan — Business Hub

Quick read: After graduation, apply for Karta Pobytu (Polish residence card). PR eligible after 5 years legal residence. Citizenship after 3 years PR + B1 Polish + integration. EU passport unlocks visa-free travel to 190+ countries.

- Karta Pobytu (Residence Card): After graduation, apply for 12-month job search residence
- Permanent Residence: After 5 years legal residence + B1 Polish + economic integration
- Citizenship: 3 years after PR + B1 Polish + integration test + clean record
- Total naturalization time: 8-10 years
- Polish citizenship benefits: EU passport, visa-free to 190+ countries, EU work/study rights

50 Real Questions, Real Answers

These are the most common questions Indian families ask me about Poland.

Q: Is Poland really one-third the cost of Germany?

A: Yes for total cost. Polish tuition EUR 3,000-4,000/year vs Germany FREE. But Polish living costs EUR 500-700/month vs Germany EUR 800-1,200/month. Polish 2-year total Rs 12-18 lakh vs Germany Rs 18-30 lakh.

Q: Are Polish degrees EU-recognized?

A: YES. Fully EU-recognized. You can work anywhere in EU after Polish degree without additional credentialing. Many Indians use Poland as stepping stone to Germany/Netherlands.

Q: Will my Polish degree be respected in India?

A: Yes — Polish technical degrees from Warsaw UT, AGH, Jagiellonian are respected by TCS, Infosys, Capgemini, IBM, Accenture. They prefer Polish-trained engineers for European deployments.

Q: Is Polish hard to learn?

A: Yes — Polish is among harder Slavic languages. But you don't need it for studies (English programs). A1-A2 enough for daily life.

Q: Can I work part-time as a student?

A: Yes — full-time during holidays, up to 20 hours/week during semester. EUR 5-10/hour typical. EUR 400-700/month possible.

Q: How safe is Poland?

A: Top 30 globally safe. Very safe for Indian students. Warsaw and Krakow are very safe walkable cities.

Q: Is Polish food good for Indians?

A: Cold winters (-5 to 0°C), warm summers (20-25°C). Pack warm coat. Skiing in Polish Tatras.

Q: Can I get scholarships at Warsaw UT?

A: Yes — NAWA scholarship (EUR 350/month + tuition waiver), Warsaw UT Excellence, Erasmus Mundus.

Q: Is MBBS in Poland respected in India?

A: Yes — Polish MBBS is FMGE-recognized. Need to clear NEXT exam to practice in India. 6-year English MBBS at Jagiellonian costs EUR 14,000-16,000/year.

Q: What's the salary range for IT engineers in Poland?

A: EUR 25-45K starting (Rs 23-42 lakh). Top companies (Google, Microsoft) pay 30-50% more. After 5 years: EUR 50-90K possible.

Q: Can I bring my family on dependent visa?

A: Yes — spouse and minor children can join. Spouse can work after 6 months in Poland.

Q: How long does Polish visa take?

A: 6-10 weeks. Apply via VFS Poland (Delhi, Mumbai, Chennai, Bangalore, Hyderabad, Kolkata, Ahmedabad, Pune).

Q: What's PESEL?

A: PESEL is Polish national identification number, similar to Aadhar. Required for healthcare, banking, employment.

Q: Can I do MBA in Poland?

A: Yes — Warsaw School of Economics (SGH), Akademia Leona Kozmieskiego in Warsaw, Krakow School of Business at AGH. EUR 10,000-25,000 MBA tuition (cheaper than Western Europe).

Q: Will my Indian wedding be valid in Poland?

A: Yes if apostilled by Indian MEA. Civil marriage at Polish commune (Urząd Stanu Cywilnego).

Q: Can I get scholarships in addition to admission?

A: Apply for NAWA when applying for admission. Some unis offer merit scholarships automatically based on grades.

Q: What's the difference between Warsaw UT and AGH?

A: Warsaw UT is in Warsaw (capital, more jobs, slightly higher cost). AGH is in Krakow (beautiful city, lower cost). Warsaw UT stronger in CS/Civil; AGH stronger in Mining/Materials.

Q: Is University of Warsaw better than Warsaw UT?

A: Different focus: University of Warsaw is for sciences/humanities/law. Warsaw UT is for engineering/CS/architecture. Both top Polish universities.

Q: Can I work in Germany after Polish Master's?

A: YES — full EU work rights. Many of our students do 2-3 years in Poland then move to Germany/Netherlands for 2x salaries.

Q: How is the Indian community?

A: 8,000+ Indians nationwide. Warsaw 4,000+, Krakow 2,000+, Wroclaw 700+. Active student associations, Hindu temples, Indian restaurants.

Q: What insurance do I need?

A: Health insurance MANDATORY. NFZ (Polish public, free for students), or private insurance EUR 30-50/month.

Q: How is the cost of food monthly?

A: Cooking at home: EUR 100-150/month. Restaurant meals EUR 5-10. Total food budget: EUR 150-220/month (cheapest in EU).

Q: Can I apply to MBBS in Poland with NEET?

A: Yes — NEET is accepted by Polish medical schools for English MBBS programs. CGPA + NEET both considered.

Q: What's NAWA scholarship?

A: Polish National Agency for Academic Exchange. EUR 350/month + tuition waiver for Master's. Apply by April 30 via go-poland.pl.

Q: How is the Polish work culture?

A: Less hierarchical than Germany, more relaxed than Western Europe. Punctuality important but flexible.

Q: Can I get post-study work permit?

A: Yes — Karta Pobytu (residence card) for job search. Convert to work permit once employed.

Q: Is Polish English level good?

A: Mixed. Young people (under 35) and tech workers speak good English. Older generation, government offices may need help.

Q: What's the best month to arrive?

A: September for October intake. February for March intake. Avoid Christmas (Polish offices closed).

Q: Will Polish degree help with PR in other EU countries?

A: Yes — EU degree, work experience in Poland helps when applying for German EU Blue Card, Dutch Highly Skilled Migrant, etc.

Q: Can I do PhD after Polish Master's?

A: Yes — Polish PhDs fully funded EUR 1,200-1,800/month stipend. Or move to Germany/Netherlands for higher PhD funding.

Q: Is Krakow safer than Warsaw?

A: Similar safety. Krakow has lower crime due to smaller size. Both excellent for Indians.

Q: How do I find apartment in Warsaw?

A: OLX.pl, Otodom.pl, Facebook Polish housing groups. Apply 2-3 months ahead. EUR 350-500/mo for student room.

Q: Can I drive in Poland with Indian license?

A: For first 6 months. After, must convert to Polish/EU license. EUR 60-80 + practical test.

Q: What's Polish IT industry like?

A: Booming. Google, Microsoft, IBM, Intel all expanding. Polish engineers known for quality. EUR 25-90K salary range.

Q: Is Lodz a good student city?

A: Yes — cheapest major Polish university city. Lodz UT is strong in chemistry, engineering, film. EUR 450-600/month total.

Q: Can I do internships during studies?

A: Yes — most Polish Master's include 3-6 month internships. Stipends EUR 600-1,200/month.

Q: How is medical care for Indians in Poland?

A: NFZ public insurance covers basics. Polish doctors generally speak English in major cities. Some specialists may need translator.

Q: Are there Indian temples in Poland?

A: ISKCON Warsaw, Hindu temple in Krakow. Small Sikh community in Warsaw and Lodz.

Q: What's the GPA conversion?

Show deep research. Mention specific courses, faculty, research groups.

Paragraph 5: Why Poland / Warsaw UT

Explain choice. Mention Warsaw's European tech ecosystem, affordable EU education, post-study EU work mobility.

Paragraph 6: Career Vision

Articulate 5-year vision. Honest about whether to stay EU or return India.
